PEACE DAY PHILLY PROMOTES PEACE ACROSS THE REGION SEPTEMBER 17 - SEPTEMBER 21, 2018

Philadelphia, PA (August 21, 2018) - PEACE DAY PHILLY, the local initiative for the United Nations International Day of Peace, will present events across the region for the eighth consecutive year. A wide range of programs on topics related to personal, local and global peace are scheduled. Peace Day Philly invites individuals, organizations, city offices and neighborhoods to participate in this effort through engaging in meaningful peace-related activities in their home, school or community, or by attending a Peace Day Philly program—most are free. In addition to these events, the Philadelphia Police Department will host various free programs in districts across the city related to peace, including many with youth in partnership with schools.

"Peace Day is a terrific opportunity for each of us to reflect on what we can do to build greater peace within ourselves, our communities, and our city," said Mayor Jim Kenney. "Now more than ever it is important that we celebrate our diversity and come together in a show of peace and love for one another. On Peace Day, I encourage all Philadelphians to be agents of peace by fostering positive engagement that will carry on throughout the year."

This year's global theme, set by the United Nations, is "The Right to Peace - The Universal Declaration of Human Rights at 70." United Nations Secretary-General António Guterres said, "It is time all nations and all people live up to the words of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights, which recognizes the inherent dignity and equal and inalienable rights of all members of the human race. Let us stand up for human rights for all in the name of peace for all."

"At a time when compassion, civil discourse, and human rights can be absent - not just across the world, but in our own communities - we must make room in our lives to build positive peace," said Lisa Parker, Co-Founder of Peace Day Philly. "We share Peace Day with all of humanity, and it can be a powerful beginning for making more conscious choices to build peace and greater understanding on a daily basis."
