



## ***Peace Day Activity Ideas for High School Students***

The United Nations International Day of Peace (**Peace Day**) is observed worldwide on (and around) **September 21**. Peace Day provides a powerful opportunity for students to consider the concept of positive peace and how they can be active peacebuilders in their world.

- Reach out to local officials via Twitter or letter and tell them what peace means to you in your community.
- Observe a minute of silence in the spirit of our desire for peace.
- Use class time sometime the week of Sept. 16 to discuss cyberbullying.
- Invite someone who is doing nonviolence or social justice work for a special assembly or interactive workshop. What are the challenges to creating a more peaceful world? What kind of actions can students take to make a difference?
- Collaboratively write a class peace pledge.
