A RESOLUTION

- 1 Supporting the ideals of Peace Day, September 21, 2014.
- 2 WHEREAS, The ideal of peace encompasses the deepest hopes of
- 3 all peoples and remains humanity's guiding inspiration; and
- 4 WHEREAS, This Commonwealth was founded by William Penn on the
- 5 principles of peace, freedom and equality; and
- 6 WHEREAS, The United Nations believes in this same vision and
- 7 works to promote the ideals and principles of peace and human
- 8 rights across the globe; and
- 9 WHEREAS, The United Nations International Day of Peace,
- 10 established in 1981, offers an annual opportunity on September
- 11 21 for countries, cities, states, communities and individuals to
- 12 "commemorate and strengthen the ideals of peace within and among
- 13 all nations and peoples"; and
- 14 WHEREAS, In 2001, the United Nations unanimously established
- 15 the United Nations International Day of Peace on September 21 to
- 16 be observed each year in promotion of global ceasefire and
- 17 nonviolence; and

- 1 WHEREAS, In 2009, the United States Senate passed S. Res. 274
- 2 (2009), a resolution expressing its support for the goals and
- 3 ideals celebrated on Peace Day and for "continuing efforts to
- 4 raise global awareness of the goals of Peace Day and to engage
- 5 all sectors of society in the peaceful observance of the
- 6 International Day of Peace"; and
- 7 WHEREAS, On September 21, 2014, people in cities across the
- 8 world come together through diverse peace education activities,
- 9 nonviolent skill-building, music, marches, spiritual activities,
- 10 arts projects, community events, environmental efforts and
- 11 intercultural dialogues, all for the purpose of forwarding a
- 12 culture of peace; and
- 13 WHEREAS, Peace Day observances are wide ranging, with many
- 14 organizations and cities across this Commonwealth, from
- 15 Philadelphia to Pittsburgh, creating practical acts of peace for
- 16 our citizens to further understand and actively participate in a
- 17 movement of nonviolence; and
- 18 WHEREAS, Peace Day Philly, a Philadelphia-region initiative
- 19 that encourages broad-based participation in the International
- 20 Day of Peace, calls upon all public officials, organizations,
- 21 neighborhoods, community groups and individuals to actively
- 22 engage in this global day of local opportunity. More than 30
- 23 diverse peace-related events will take place across the region
- 24 from September 15 through September 21. More than 25 additional
- 25 peace activities are being planned by the Philadelphia Police
- 26 Department in districts across Philadelphia; and
- 27 WHEREAS, On September 21 at 12 noon in all time zones, people
- 28 of all nationalities and religions will observe a minute of
- 29 silence for peace; and
- 30 WHEREAS, The United Nations' global theme for Peace Day 2014

- 1 is "Right of Peoples to Peace." This theme relates to a United
- 2 Nations Declaration that proclaims "the peoples of our planet
- 3 have the sacred right to peace, " and underscores the critical
- 4 relationship between human rights and peace; and
- 5 WHEREAS, The United Nations Secretary General Ban Ki-moon
- 6 reflected in his 100-day countdown statement: "History has shown
- 7 that, no matter how fierce, conflict can end, peace can prevail
- 8 and reconciliation can triumph. On 21 September...people will
- 9 broadcast this essential message and will celebrate the value of
- 10 human diversity and the strength of our unity"; and
- 11 WHEREAS, Conflict resolution and transformation, mediation,
- 12 mindfulness training and many other skill-based aspects of peace
- 13 education, as well as intercultural dialogue and other forms of
- 14 diversity and global awareness activities, are critical to the
- 15 development of peace-building skills and global citizenship
- 16 among children and youth; therefore be it
- 17 RESOLVED, That the Senate express its support for the goals
- 18 and ideals celebrated worldwide on September 21, 2014, and
- 19 encourage and commend all citizens of this Commonwealth who
- 20 actively promote and participate in diverse peace, nonviolence
- 21 and unity-building activities in observance of the International
- 22 Day of Peace.
